She was Chairman of the Board of Directors of Central Lationamericana de Valores (Latin Clear), Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors of Latinex Holdings, Inc. and was a Director of the Panama Stock Exchange. She was also Chairperson of the UN Sustainable Stock Exchanges (SSE) and the World Federation of Exchanges (WFE) Advisory Group.

Bill Roberts

Head of Open Banking at the Competition and Markets Authority, United Kingdom

Bill is Head of Open Banking at the Competition and Markets Authority (CMA), the main competition authority in the UK.

Bill was part of the team which investigated the UK's retail banking market between 2014 and 2016 and led the design of the open banking remedies, discussions over the creation of the Open Banking Implementation Entity (OBIE) and the appointment of the Implementation Trustee (IT).

He has since worked closely on the implementation of open banking in the UK, and closely follows the adoption of open banking in other jurisdictions.

Bill is also a member of the FCA's open finance advisory group which is exploring the application of open banking principles to a wider range of products, and the Government's Smart Data Working Group, looking at applying the same principles in other regulated sectors.

Prior to his time at the CMA, Bill worked at the its predecessor, the Competition Commission, and held roles at what is now Thomson Reuters and the UK Consumers' Association, Which?.



Diogo Silva

Head of Division, Open Banking, Central Bank of Brazil

Diogo Silva is head of division in the financial system regulation department at the Central Bank of Brazil. He has extensive experience dealing with financial system regulation issues, having spent the past 14 years researching market trends and innovative regulatory approaches in order to mitigate market failures and promote fair business conduct from market participants. For the past year he has led the team responsible for proposing the open banking regulatory strategy in Brazil, while also being responsible at the Central Bank of Brazil's Open Banking Committee for leading discussions pertaining new business models and operational procedures related with the implementation of Open Banking in Brazil.

Diogo holds a bachelor of economics degree from the University of Brasilia and a post–graduate degree on Organizational Communication and Management from FIA Business School.





Carlos Figueredo
CEO, Open Vector

Carlos Figueredo is the CEO and Founder of Open Vector, a professional consultancy firm founded in 2017 specialising in open banking, PSD2, GDPR and payments. Open Vector advise governments and central banks on open banking implementation across the financial sector and promote financial and social inclusion, while working closely with the Fintech community. Carlos is a recognised open banking SME with 20+ year payments, SWIFT, SEPA and PSD2 experience.

Carlos' open banking experience started in 2016 as the Head of Data Standards for the UK Open Banking Implementation Entity (OBIE). He oversaw the ISO 20022 based standard development and the relevant technical elements to integrate it across the array of product-based API's which was the first initiative globally in the banking sector, or any other sector, to have done so.

Prior roles include leading large-scale program integration and standardization, primarily in payments, for banks such as Barclays, HSBC, and Credit Suisse.



Ramiro Blazquez
Head of Research and Strategy, BancTrust & Co.

Prior to joining BancTrust, Ramiro was Head of Research at Mills Capital Markets, an Argentine brokerage house. In the previous ten years, he worked as Senior Latam Economist for HSBC Global Research, covering the major South American countries. He was also an economist at the IMF's Argentina office, Managing Director at Universidad Di Tella's Center for Financial Research (CIF) and adviser for the Presidential office during Fernando De la Rúa's term.

Ramiro has taught several courses at Universidad Torcuato Di Tella, both at graduate and undergraduate levels. He is a former Chevening Scholar, a fellowship granted by the United Kingdom's Foreign Commonwealth Office.
