President of the Republic of Panama



President Laurentino Cortizo was elected President of the Republic of Panama in 2019.

He holds a Business Administration degree from Norwich University, USA, a Master's degree in Business Administration, and Ph.D. studies in International Business and Marketing at the University of Texas in Austin.

Mr. Cortizo was elected to Panama's National Assembly in 1994, and re-elected in 2004. During that period, he became First Vice President of the

National Assembly (1998), and in 2000 was appointed its President. In this role, he implemented initiatives such as the Austerity Program with Efficiency, and the Directorate of Citizen Participation. He also chaired committees on Public Works, Agricultural Affairs and Trade. Mr. Cortizo was appointed Minister of Agricultural Development in 2004.

In 2016, Mr. Cortizo successfully ran as a presidential candidate for the Democratic Revolutionary Party, and was elected as the 38th President of the Republic of Panama in 2019 for a five-year period.

On Monday 1st November, Canning House will host a Canning Lecture with His Excellency Laurentino Cortizo, President of the Republic of Panama, in Glasgow.

The President, whose Canning Lecture in Glasgow coincides with his visit to the United Kingdom for the United Nations Climate Change Conference (COP26), will speak on the topic: 'Panama: Gateway to Latin America.'

Lord Mountevans, Honorary President of Canning House, will inaugurate the event and welcome attendees. After the President has delivered his lecture, there will be an opportunity for audience questions, moderated by Cristina Cortes, Canning House CEO. The event will be followed by a networking reception.

Since 1997, the Canning Lecture has been delivered by a visiting Latin American or Iberian President or Head of Government. The Canning Lecture is one of the most high-profile such events in the UK, and a unique opportunity to hear from and engage directly with a current Latin American or Iberian leader.

He worked at international shipbroking firm Clarksons for 45 years, and now chairs the board of Maritime London, in addition to other leading roles in British shipping organisations. Lord Mountevans has been Canning House's Honorary President since 2018.
